Reopen We are delighted that the school reopened from 1st June with some of our youngest and oldest pupils returning to school to learn in small 'pods' with a teacher. Whilst the structure of the school day is very different and the children must adapt to practising social distancing in the class room and at playtimes, it is wonderful to see how happy the children are to be back with some of their peers, to see their teachers and to get to grips with school-based learning again. They particularly love the fact that they must have their own pencil cases in school to avoid sharing equipment with others! Following on from further government announcements, we are looking forward to welcoming back more pupils from Years 2,3,4,5 from the start of July to join our Keyworker Pod and Year 6 and Nursery/Reception/Year

Home Based Learning We continue to work closely with all our families who remain home-based, providing daily and weekly lessons and topic web activities to complete and we regularly support parents with their learning questions. Recent topics have included the fairy tale adventures called *'Once Upon A Time'* and a physically challenging topic called *'Health, Fitness & Sport'*. Both topics were taught in school and by our parents and carers at home and it has been wonderful to receive lots of pupil's work from parents and photographs of the children carrying out their Science, Art and Music lessons in the house and more often than not the garden! Giant gingerbread men biscuits, Jack's magic beans growing very tall, measuring pulses and creating giant maps of the digestive system are just a few examples which spring to mind. Thank you to all our families who continue to rise to the challenge of home learning, you are doing a brilliant job in challenging circumstances.



Zooming On Up

This term the staff have developed their technological skills further to plan and deliver class sessions to children at home using Zoom. Class Sessions have focussed on a quiz, show & tell and listening to stories, jokes and poems. There have also been whole school assemblies and this month we plan to welcome both our new Reception intake via Zoom and then give all our children a chance to meet their new teachers for next year in a Zoom Moving Up session. It is amazing how technology provides us with the capacity to be together as a school community - even when we are apart ensuring we continue to focus on delivering our ethos of Cherish All, Achieve Together despite the physical separation.

Content from Dr Dan Poulter June 2020

The COVID-19 pandemic has changed all of our lives. Britain has been forced to implement restrictions and new rules that our country has not experienced since the Second World War. Many people are still working from home and we remain unable to freely see people that we love and care about. But these ongoing measures are necessary to halt the spread of the virus and to protect lives.

Our Prime Minister, Boris Johnson, has recently announced the Government's intention to take the first careful steps in modifying some of the restrictions facing our daily lives and these remain under constant review. However, it remains vitally important that we all continue to respect and follow Government advice so that we don't risk a second wave of infection. A second wave would have devastating consequences for our NHS and for our economy. In my view, it is essential that we continue to be led by the scientific evidence, which dictates which restrictions can start to be lifted and when.

We must all continue to play our part in helping prevent the spread of the COVID-19 virus by:

- Maintaining social distancing - keeping at least 2 metres apart from people who are not from your own household helps to protect each other and reduces the spread of the virus;

- Ensuring good hand hygiene - thoroughly washing your hands and wrists before eating and when returning home after leaving the house is particularly important to protect yourself from catching the virus;

- And to protect others, it is important **NOT** to leave home if you or anyone in your household has Coronavirus symptoms

Since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, my office and I have continued to work hard on behalf of everyone in Central Suffolk and North Ipswich, helping people to access personal and business financial support, and also helping a great many people who were stranded overseas as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic to return home. I continue to ask probing Parliamentary questions of our Government about its response to the pandemic and continue to raise issues that matter to us here in Suffolk in Parliament and directly with Government ministers.
